The Chairman advised that he attended the Sealand Remembrance Service on Sunday 8th November 2015 at St. Bartholomew's Church.

15/145 <u>COUNCIL'S CHAIN / BADGE OF OFFICE</u>

The Chairman said that he will enquire about having the chain engraved locally

Councillor John Dodd said he will bring the Council's original chain of office to the next meeting.

15/146 POLICE ISSUES

The Clerk advised that Martin Price and Dave Huxley are not available to attend the meeting.

Martin had provided a report -

- 1 Patrols have been continuing in the area.
- 2 A complaint has been received re males getting off a private bus and causing a nuisance. Enquiries are on-going.
- 3 Karting event Operation Bang' took place on 2nd November 2015 with 14 youth members of the community taking part. Excellent opportunity to engage with positive results.
- 4 There was an incident reported where damage was believed to have occurred at Sealand Primary School. On closer inspection the wooden chair had been pushed over as it was only secured with 4 extra-long nails/screws being pushed into the ground. No actual damage to the chair.
- 5 Consideration requested for funding towards opening the Youth club during the summer holidays as it is currently closed for the 6/7 week period. This would provide a venue for the youths to attend and hopefully reduce Anti-Social Behaviour incidents.

The Clerk advised that he has asked Martin to clarify this report.

15/147 <u>FLINTSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL MATTERS</u>

a) Litter Bins and Benches – Sealand Manor Recreation Field

It was reported that the litter bins and benches will shortly be installed.

b) Additional Waiting Restrictions – Farm Road and Foxes Lane

The County Councillor advised that reported complaints are being investigated.

c) Welsh Road Recreation Field - Gate(s)

It was reported that the gates on Welsh Road have been temporarily removed to enable contractors to access the field. The gates will be refitted on completion of the works.

RESOLVED – that the report be noted.

d) Ferry Lane Foot Bridge – Remedial Repairs / Vibration Noise Levels

The Clerk advised that he awaits an update from Wayne Jones – Flintshire County Council regarding works required to the bridge.

RESOLVED – that Wayne Jones – Flintshire County Council be asked to obtain a provide report.

e) Sealand Manor - West Green Ditch

Wayne Jones has previously advised he will investigate the ditch to determine whether work is required to improve the drainage flow

RESOLVED – that the report be noted.

f) Green Lane East – Clarification of Responsibility to Maintain as a Bridleway

It was reported that pot holes have been filled in.

RESOLVED – that the report be noted.

g) Foxes Lane Corner/ West Green – Mud on the Road

RESOLVED – that the County Councillor will request that the Council's road sweeper vehicle should clear the affected section of road.

h) Sealand Road - Lights Off

The County Councillor advised that the Council's Lighting Engineer is fully aware of the lights that are not working and that all affected lights have been marked with tape to identify that they require attention.

RESOLVED – that the report be noted.

15/148 <u>LIGHTING MATTERS</u>

a) Street Lighting Report

All lights 128 columns / 124 lights are working – four lights are not working – 91 and 92 Sealand Avenue, 56 at West Green / Manor Road and 34 at Station Cottages. These have all reported to the County Council.

RESOLVED – that the report be noted.

b) Electrical Inspection / Structural Inspection of Street Lights

At the July 2015 meeting Darell Jones confirmed that all lights have now been electrically tested and the project will not need to be restarted until 2018. Darell also advised that the Council should commence a structural inspection programme which would identify the lights that Council should replace.

The Clerk has asked Darell Jones to advise Council by December 2015 which 8 / 10 lights following structural inspections should be considered for replacement in 2016/17. This is still awaited.

RESOLVED – that the report be noted.

c) Lighting Improvements – 2015/16

Council has now received an invoice from Flintshire County Council in respect of the replacement columns installed at Sealand Manor and column 105 at Sandy Lane

Replacement columns 158 and 159 at Riverside Park have been installed and await the transfer from the old columns – total cost including adoption is £4,460.

RESOLVED – that the report be noted.

d) Change of Street Lighting at High Grove Estate – Columns 31 and 32

At the July 2015 meeting Council agreed that Column 31 should be removed and that further consideration be given at the September 2015 meeting regarding the removal of column 32.

It was concluded that 32 should be retained and reviewed in six months.

The Clerk advised that he has been informed that Column 31 will shortly be removed.

a) Community Green Spaces Funding

Ella Jackson, Engagement Worker for Older People, Flintshire & Wrexham Online Watch Link Association

Communities will soon be able to apply for grants of up to £12,000 for capital improvements to local community greenspaces.

Projects that would typically receive funding include:

- · Parks, pocket parks and urban greenspaces.
- · Green corridors river and canals, cycle ways.
- · Formal and informal play areas.
- Open access sports facilities within public parks and recreation grounds, such as football pitches, tennis courts and cricket pitches.
- · Informal outdoor facilities, such as gym equipment, trim trails and woodland walks.
- · Nature reserves, community woodlands and ponds.
- · Churchyards.
- · Seafronts.
- · Community allotments, community garden.

The grants programme will be open to voluntary and community organisations, registered charities, health bodies, community councils, development trusts, local authorities and housing organisations in England, Scotland and Wales.

It is anticipated that there will be two funding rounds per year over the next three years.

The first funding round is expected to open to applications on 19 October 2015 with a deadline of 30 November 2015.

c) John Summers High School Ian Budd - Chief Officer, Education & Youth, Flintshire County Council

It was requested that this issue be considered by Council and should Councillors have any further observations please can you let us know by no later than Friday 27th November 2015 or at your earliest convenience following your next available Community Council meeting.

Members of your Community Council will be aware of the recent consultation in relation to John Summers High School which ran from 5th June 2015 to July 2015. During this period the Council sought the views of schools, communities, children and young People and other statutory consultees on the proposals to close John Summers High school. The Council received a high number of responses to the consultation and felt it prudent to feedback the views of the consultees to the Community Council.

Whilst, the Council did receive a number of positive responses to the consultation, notably from other local secondary schools and Estyn (the independent education inspectorate). The majority of the views expressed by children and young people, and mirrored by adult responses during the consultation period, expressed areas of concern summarised as follows:

concern about travel - increase in travel time, travel costs, dangerous route to get to a
new school, increased traffic congestion;
concern about impact on friendships - splitting friends up as they may attend different
schools;
impact on education – may not do as well in another school;
impact on the local community;
impact on teachers – knowing their learning styles, what would happen to them,
concern over inconsistency arising from teachers getting new jobs and leaving the
current school);

uniform – assurances sought about parents with children already in secondary school
needing to buy new uniform;
concern about safety and wellbeing (including pastoral care) being different in
another school; and
concern about overcrowding in classrooms in other schools.

These are areas that the Council is continuing to address through its decision making, implementation plans and ongoing communication.

The Community Council will be aware through its County Councillor membership that the Council is continuing to work with the local high schools on detailed transition plans to ensure continuity of education for pupils transferring to other schools, should the Minister determine to close John Summers High School.

Additionally, Cabinet had previously given a commitment to receiving a full and separate report on transport options. This will be considered by the County Council's Cabinet prior to Christmas.

Should your Councillors have any further observations that are not mentioned above please can you let us know by no later than Friday 27th November 2015.
